The Personal Touch


The traditional office is constantly evolving – over and over again


My personal sphere

The new Sedus INSIGHTS N° 16 explores how personal technology is changing the way we work and why companies should welcome it.

There was a time when people used to say: "my desk is my castle". Exactly 10 years ago, a book with this title by Uta Brandes and Michael Erlhoff, described the employees' desk as a means of expression, acknowledging the importance of the freedom to personalise it, to create ownership and a sense of belonging. Today, first the proliferation of digital technology and then the pandemic have transformed the way we work. Multiple and different furnishings are now available to choose from – we have the freedom to customise much more than just a work surface.


In our diffused way of working, personal tools have significantly increased in both quantity and performance: they are no longer limited to a laptop or mobile phone, but involve apps, sharing platforms, wearables, sensors, microphones and cameras. They all require an internet connection, share data on the cloud and promise to help us manage our lives in a better way. Researchers say that there are already ten connected tools that can talk to each other in an average US household. This trend is expected to increase exponentially in both the home and the office in the next few years.

In general, we all tend to consider these objects not as mere tools, but as true extensions of our bodies and minds; we express our creativity, share knowledge and try to personalise the space we live in according to our needs.



By listening to our favourite song with a pair of headphones, an anonymous space is mentally transformed into the right place to concentrate; by connecting from home to a digital board we collaborate almost as if we were all in the same room. For this to work, rather than adapting to the space, we adapt the space around us – should it be home, office or something in between. We start to create and configure our own "personal sphere" in line with our individual needs and preferences.

This phenomenon confirms the essential new role of the hybrid office in becoming both a meeting place and a platform for collaboration between people. Moreover, it has now evolved to be a place for a connection and dialogue between different digital environments and different working devices. How profoundly this is changing the way we work is evident in the words of Laura Ryan, Director of International HR and Dublin Site Leader at Dropbox, interviewed in this issue of Sedus INSIGHTS.





The company, which is among the first in the world to offer cloud-based services, has taken the opportunity of the pandemic to redesign its work processes – offering more space and independence to its workers – without neglecting the redesign of its physical work spaces (the San Francisco and Dublin offices are case studies within this issue of INSIGHTS).

In the interview, Laura explains what the pillars of the company's "Virtual First" philosophy are. The emphasis is on the use of personal technology but not at the expense of the well-being of the worker – the real sticking point in any form of remote working. Acknowledging that "more technology is not always better technology", Dropbox's new policy drives the interaction between workers by "protecting" the personal sphere, adopting "Core Collaboration Hours" (4 hours a day dedicated to online/offline meetings), using asynchronous collaboration methods, promoting "unplugged time" from technological tools, and especially by enhancing in the physical office all face-to-face exchanges, fostering creativity, collaboration and a sense of belonging.

Integrating personal and company resources has proven to be a great opportunity to restructure and improve work processes. However, this issue of INSIGHTS does not hide the pitfalls for both workers and companies. As we move toward a "seamless experience" that aims to intertwine different tools, promoting productivity and workers' well-being, we cannot overlook what the friction points and challenges are. Without careful workflow management, adequate technological support, a corporate culture open to innovation, and clear security and privacy protocols, everything we consider desirable could turn into frustration and an unnecessary expenditure of resources.

It is a challenging transition and the impression is that we are still at the beginning of technologies like artificial intelligence and virtual reality, with which the personalisation of the workplace could reach unpredictable scenarios, between the somehow "scary" promises of the Metaverse and the creation of an integrated digital world that truly serves humans: in both cases the objective should remain to embrace technology to meet the multiple needs and demands of our individual spheres.
